

Mannkal Foundation Honours Scholarship * [F13194]

The Mannkal Foundation whose aim is to strengthen the free market system in Western Australia and Australia by promoting ideals of voluntary co-operation, choice, personal rights, limited government and responsible resourcefulness of individuals has committed a sum of money each year to provide a scholarship at The University of Western Australia ("the University") for an honours student to undertake their research project on the benefits of voluntary private initiatives versus compulsory government programs.

The scholarship, which is available to students from the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, the Faculty of law and the UWA Business School, is established and administered in accordance with the following conditions.

Title

1. The scholarship is called the Mannkal Foundation Honours Scholarship.

Value

2. The value of the scholarship is \$10,000.

Purpose

3. The purpose of the scholarship is to encourage students who demonstrate academic excellence in their undergraduate studies at the University, to pursue an honours degree course with a research project investigating the benefits of voluntary private initiatives versus compulsory government programs.

Eligibility Requirements

4. (1) To be eligible for consideration an applicant must have –

(a) demonstrated academic achievement in their undergraduate studies; and

(b) been accepted for full-time enrolment in an honours degree course in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, the Faculty of Law or the UWA Business School.

Body Responsible for Selection

5. The selection committee for the scholarship is the Scholarships Committee.

Selection Criteria

6. The scholarship is awarded to the applicant who, in the opinion of the selection committee, best demonstrates –

(a) academic achievement; and

(b) the relevance of their proposed research project to the purpose of the scholarship.

Selection Process

7. Selection of the recipient is made by the Scholarships Committee having regard to the students' academic records and written applications.

Awarding Body

8. The scholarship is awarded by the Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the relevant faculty.

Method of Payment

9. The scholarship is paid in fortnightly instalments.

Duration of Award

10. The scholarship is tenable for two semesters which are normally consecutive.

Application Procedure

11. (1) Written applications are called for annually by the Graduate Research and Scholarships Office from students who have been accepted for enrolment in an honours course at the University in any of the following faculties: Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty of Law, and the UWA Business School.

(2) Applications must be submitted to the Graduate Research and Scholarships Office by the advertised closing date.

(3) Applications must include details of the student's research project and a short statement of no more than 500 words demonstrating how their chosen project aligns with the purpose of the scholarship.

Administering Body

12. The scholarship is administered by the Graduate Research and Scholarships Office.

Publications

13. Any thesis, dissertation or other publication resulting from research undertaken by the recipient while in receipt of the Mannkal Foundation Honours Scholarship must acknowledge the support of the scholarship and carry the University by-line.
