

UWA Fogarty Foundation Scholarships

The purpose of the matrix is to support you with your application.

There are five key categories and levels of achievement. You will be assessed only on your highest level of achievement in each category.

Use the matrix to facilitate your achievements. All applications go through a rigorous process. Eligible applications are assessed through a selection panel. Each applicant is allocated points to the category in which they have applied for. Applicants with the highest overall points will be shortlisted for the next stage of the selection process which is the Interview stage.

You will not receive additional points for entering the same achievement in two or more categories e.g. school choir captain under arts and leadership.

Initiatives is a 'bonus' area of assessment. Please submit a short (maximum 300 words) synopsis of an initiative you have developed or in which you have significantly contributed. been a significant contributor of. Initiatives include creating a program, product or Service; – to trying to solve a problem or is of benefit to others. For example; starting a small business, developing an app, creating a volunteering program, running an event or building a network of people.

Guiding questions for the submission -






What is the initiative? What was the motivation for creating or being involved in the initiative? Does the initiative generate income or is there a social dividend? What support, funding, skills development or mentoring have you received from others?

Please note Only Year 11 and 12 achievements will be considered and you will only be assessed on the highest achievements in three categories.
