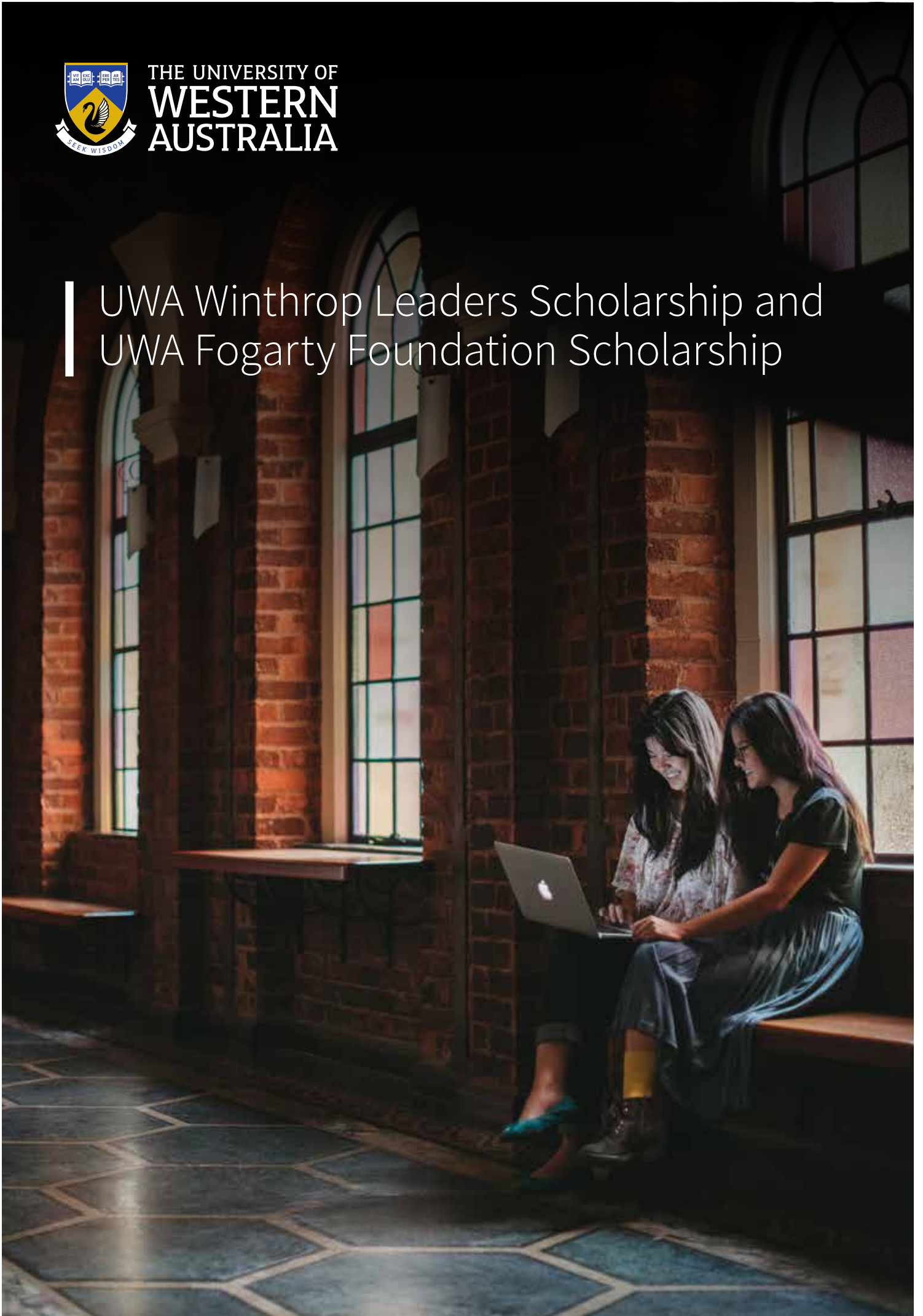

# UWA Fogarty Foundation Scholarship and UWA Winthrop Leaders Scholarship

The University of Western Australia offers prestigious scholarships to attract senior secondary students who show significant academic potential, together with leadership ability and other outstanding achievements in Years 11 and 12. We award a total of 20 scholarships per year.

## Award details

---

As a UWA Fogarty Foundation and UWA Winthrop Leaders Scholar, you'll receive:

- \$10,000 per annum for up to eight semesters (four years) for the undergraduate component of your degree
- \$10,000 per annum for up to eight semesters for the postgraduate component of your degree and
- Participation in a prestigious leadership program, offering a variety of opportunities for networking, public speaking, leadership development and more

## Eligibility requirements

---

To be eligible to apply, applicants are required to:

- be enrolled as a domestic student in Year 12 at a Western Australian secondary school at the time of application
- demonstrate outstanding academic achievements during Years 11 and 12, as well as demonstrated excellence in at least three areas of arts, community service, leadership or sports
- have a predicted minimum ATAR of 98 (or above) or 95 (or above) if you attend a Tier A Broadway UWA-identified school and
- nominate UWA as their first preference in the main round of TISC offers





## Submitting your application

---

- Applications are open January to May each year.
- Your principal will be required to provide a 'School Principal's Endorsement Form' as evidence of support for your application for the scholarship. This form should outline your predicted ATAR based on your Year 11 results. Ensure that you provide this form to your school principal to fill out on your behalf. - Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend an interview during the July school holidays and will be advised of the time and date in June.
- The scholarship is conditional upon achieving the required ATAR.



**Before starting your application, prepare your supporting documents detailing your achievements. Refer to the information below:**

There are five categories with a new bonus category 'Initiatives'. You will need to demonstrate excellence in at least three of the five categories and the bonus category if you can support this for bonus points, you will submit a synopsis of your activity/achievements for your initiatives.

The categories are as follows:

- Academic,
- Arts,
- Community Contribution,
- Leadership or
- Sport

Each category has five levels of assessments:

- Selection for or achievement at intra-school or one-off events
- Selection for or achievement at school or local community level
- Selection for or achievement at regional or district level
- Selection for or achievement at state level
- Selection for or achievement at national level

Note: You may add up to 4 new achievements per category which may outline different level of assessment. You will not receive additional points for entering the same achievement in two or more categories e.g. school choir captain under arts and leadership. Use the **MATRIX** which can also be found on [scholarships.uwa.edu.au/futurestudents/uwa-fogarty-foundation](https://scholarships.uwa.edu.au/futurestudents/uwa-fogarty-foundation). It will provide you guidance in your application process.



### **Requirement for the ‘bonus’ category:**

Initiatives is a ‘bonus’ area of assessment. You will need to submit a short (maximum 300 words) synopsis of an initiative you have developed or in which you have significantly contributed. Been a significant contributor of. Initiatives include creating a program, product or Service; – to trying to solve a problem or is of benefit to others. For example; starting a small business, developing an app, creating a volunteering program, running an event or building a network of people.

### **Guiding questions for the submission -**

What is the initiative?

What was the motivation for creating or being involved in the initiative?

Does the initiative generate income or is there a social dividend?

What support, funding, skills development or mentoring have you received from others?

### **Assessment Process**

All applications go through a rigorous process. Eligible applications are assessed through a selection panel. Each applicant is allocated points to the category in which they have applied for. Applicants with the highest overall points will be shortlisted for the next stage of the selection process which is the Interview stage.
