

GERALD FRANK BROWN SCHOLARSHIPS

INFORMATION SHEET FOR APPLICATIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

1. OBJECTIVE

To financially assist students from the European Economic Community wishing to study on exchange at a university in Western Australia.

2. TENURE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarships will be offered for one or two regular semesters of the academic year

Successful applicants must complete the full term of the Scholarship. In the event the successful applicant does not complete the full term of the Scholarship (except in the case of extenuating circumstances), The University of Western Australia may request the successful applicant to repay either a whole or a part of the Scholarship as it thinks fit.

The University of Western Australia may terminate a Scholarship at any time for unsatisfactory conduct, for breach of any condition of the Scholarship, or failure to make satisfactory progress.

Commencing dates will be negotiated between selected individuals and The University of Western Australia.

3. VALUE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarship is valued at AUD\$2,000. Recipients will receive the Scholarship as soon as reasonably practicable, after arriving in Perth, Western Australia.

No additional payments or allowances will be awarded. Students will therefore be personally responsible for all other expenses, which include the following:

- i. Transportation to and from the host institution
- ii. Room and board expenses
- iii. Medical Insurance
- iv. Student Union fees, if applicable

- v. Textbooks, clothing and personal expenses
- vi. Passport and visa costs
- vii. All other debts and incidental expenses incurred during the course of the exchange programme

The monetary value of the Scholarship will be reviewed when appropriate by the Western Australian Government.

4. PREREQUISITES FOR APPLICATION

- i. Applicants must have applied for a Student Exchange programme at The University of Western Australia and will not be considered for a Scholarship until accepted in the Student Exchange Programme.
- ii. Applicants will participate in the Scholarship in an individual capacity
- iii. Students should have completed at least the first year of a full time course of study at their home institution.
- iv. Graduates and undergraduates must be a permanent resident of a country in the European Economic Community and enrolled in a course of full-time study at a tertiary institution in the European Economic Community which has a formal exchange programme in place with The University of Western Australia.
- v. Students from all faculties within the scope of the exchange agreement will be eligible to compete for the Scholarship.

Applicants must meet the following minimum requirements:

5. ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must normally have completed at least one year of university study at the time of entry to The University of Western Australia and hold at least a 3.0 GPA (Grade Point Average) on a 4.0 scale or an overall weighted average of 65%. Those applying to complete a second semester must be in good standing (weighted average of at least 50% with no fail grades) upon completion of their first semester. Students who fail to achieve this may be asked to return to their home university.

6. LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

(For universities in non-English speaking countries)

Applicants must satisfy the English Language proficiency requirement at the relevant Western Australian university (normally a TOEFL score of at least 550 or an IELTS scored of 6.5 with no individual component less than 6.0) or demonstrate equivalent competency.

7. APPLICATIONS

Applications must be submitted by the advertised closing date.

Lodgement of the application must be made directly to the Director, International Centre at The University of Western Australia.

8. GENERAL

- i. Awards will be made at the discretion of The University of Western Australia and there will be no right of appeal. The decision of made by The University of Western Australia will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- ii. The University of Western Australia retains the discretionary power to make no awards in any year in which the Scholarship is offered if it is in the opinion that some or all of the applications are not of sufficient merit to justify awards being made.
- iii. Recipients of the Scholarship will adhere to the conditions of the Gerald Frank Brown Scholarship.
- iv. Recipients of the Scholarship will abide by the general rules and conditions of the Student Exchange Programme at The University of Western Australia.
- v. Successful applicants agree to attend a welcoming ceremony or dinner shortly after their arrival in Western Australia during which they will be awarded the Scholarship.
- vi. Successful applicants may be asked to complete and return a questionnaire at completion of the Scholarship.

9. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

The following will be used in selection of candidates for the award:

- i. Academic record and language proficiency (which must meet the minimum requirements listed above)
- ii. Statement of purpose
- iii. Other sources of support
