

UWA Fogarty Scholarships – 2022 Applications

The purpose of the matrix is to support you with your application. Use the matrix to organise your achievements ensuring you include the highest impact/level of engaged and participation. There are five key categories. Up to three activities may be entered in to any one category. **A maximum of 10 activities are submitted only.**

Note you will be assessed on up to eight activities, of the highest achievements in any category. The highest achievement (highest level of participation) will be rated. The highest rating activities will be collated for ranking.

To be as clear with your achievement description as possible, include the activity (the what e.g. hockey), the participation (e.g. at school level, 4 hours a week, two terms etc) and the evidence (e.g. letter from coach, school colours). You will not receive additional points for entering the same achievement in two or more categories e.g. school choir captain under arts and leadership.

Please note only Year 11 and 12 achievements will be considered.

Initiatives is a 'bonus' area of assessment. Bonus points will be considered if you submit a synopsis of an initiative you have been significantly involved in. Initiatives include but not limited to creating a program, product or service – to try to solve a problem or is of benefit to others. For example; starting a small business; developing an app; creating a volunteering program; running an event; or building a network of people. Bonus points will be awarded based on the impact of the initiative to yourself or the community.
